What Is Hospice?

Hospice is a specialized type of care provided to the dying and their loved ones, designed to promote comfort during the end stage of life. It focuses on treating the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of the dying.

Hospice care is generally initiated when a person is given a terminal diagnosis limiting life expectancy to fewer than six months and after other medical options are exhausted or no longer deemed appropriate.

We support the whole person—spiritually, physically and emotionally.
